VII. PRACTICAL TRAINING

1. (a) Details as to how the practical training is conducted.

- The College has a group of Senior Advocates practicing in various fields, and the students are Allotted Trainer Advocates from amongst the said advocates.
- The College also organizes lecture series of various senior Advocates, eminent educationists, and Seminars for the practical approach.
- Class Moot Court Competitions are regularly organized to select students for various Inter- Collegiate, Inter-University Competitions. This exercise helps the students to gain the various skills of Litigation.
- The students have to follow the regular syllabus of the Savitribai Phule Pune University, which prescribes detailed syllabus for practical training paper.
- The students of the college are imparted Remedial English Course under the 'Per Meditatus' Programme to sharpen their skills of oration.
- Pre –trial Preparation and Interview Techniques.
- Practicing senior advocates from Pune District Court were invited to give exposure to the students of the pretrial techniques and client counseling and interview techniques.



- The College has **legal aid centre (FLAG)** which performs the function of Legal awareness, Legal Research and Free Legal Aid and advice. It also organizes Legal aid camps in the villages.

- College makes arrangements for the court visit of the students.
- Students are directed to attend one criminal case and one civil case during their visits. Some students attend the cases in Family Court. They also visit Lok Adalat organized by Pune District Court on Sundays.
- Students also visit Free Legal Aid Cell of Pune District Court and try to understand the working of the cell.
- LL.B. Final Year Students visited to the High Court of Bombay as a part of practical training.

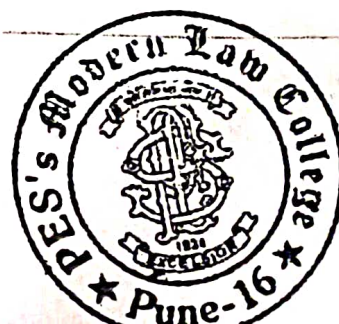
(c) Number of Moot Courts held during the year.

- The College has conducted three Moot Courts for all the classes baring B.A. LL.B. I and II.
- Moot Courts were conducted in different areas of law such as Property Law, Constitutional Law, Family Law, Criminal Law and Intellectual Property Law.

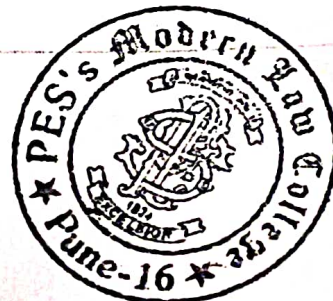

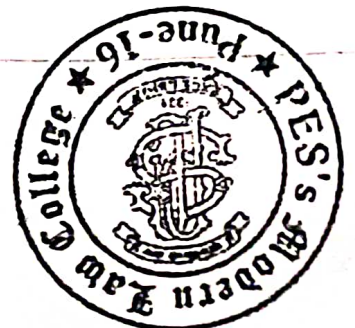


